


Everything you wanted to know about Chambers Training Funds

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How is the fund calculated?

The amount of funds each court unit may spend is based on the number of authorized judgeships and chambers staff positions (including pro se and death penalty law clerk positions) multiplied by \$400.

What is a learning and development activity?

Learning and development activities represent planned, prepared, and coordinated programs, courses, curricula, subjects, systems, or routines of instruction or education that:

- provide employees with the knowledge, skills, or abilities required to perform their jobs; or
- improve organizational performance to further the judiciary's mission and performance goals.

(cont.)

Learning and development activities should be:

- directly related to a learning objective associated with the duties and responsibilities of employees in a given court unit or FPDO; or
- found by the appropriate authorizing official to otherwise contribute to the improved performance, supervision, or management of such duties and responsibilities.

Learning and development activities cover both:

- the delivery of instruction, and
- the learning assessment of how well an individual has understood or retained the material presented (e.g., exercises, examinations).
